My Dear Parishioners,

Back in May, I received a phone call asking if St. Francis would host a priest from India who is studying in Rome. Of course, I said we would be happy to do that. Fr. Shynish Bosco arrived here in the USA for the very first time on June 3rd. Fr. Bosco has become a good friend, and I made sure to take him to plenty of the local spots that we all enjoy-Longwood Gardens, South Philly, Amish Country and soon I'll take him down to the shore. I love hosting other priests and having them live here at our parish because I'm proud of our nation, our local community here in Springfield and St. Francis parish. Fr. Bosco is heading out at the end of July so I asked him if he would be open to having a second collection on the weekend of July 26th and 27th. I appreciate your generosity. The nation of India has a population of close to 1.5 billion people but less than 5% are Christian, the rest are mostly Hindu or Muslim. Spreading the message of the Gospel is key. Fr. Bosco is from a diocese called Trivandrum and it's a community anchored by fisherfolk rooted in our Catholic faith. Trivandrum has 100 parishes and, at this moment, 12 of their priests and 3 of their seminarians are studying in Rome for higher education and they could certainly use our help. These men come from humble backgrounds and will literally move around the world to help further the cause of Christ and the message of our faith. I appreciate your help-any funds used will go directly to one of the 12 priests who are currently studying for their degrees.
