

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD Palm Sunday ~March 24, 2024 Isaiah 50:4-9a

"... The Lord GOD helps me; therefore, I have not been disgraced...."

How often do you turn to the Lord when you experience downturns and setbacks in this life? In what ways do you see how this puts the things of this world in perspective? Does this help you understand how meaningless, and fleeting are the rewards and praise of this temporal world?

Philippians 2:5-11

".... he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death-- even death on a cross...".

How can you meditate fully upon the magnitude and depth of Christ's obedience and ultimate sacrifice? Are there ways that you can visualize what He went through, both His daily deprivations as well as His excruciating Passion? In what manner do those type of meditations and visualizations help you in your walk of faith? To know the Lord was willing to endure the harsh disappointments and rejections of this world in solidarity with us?

Mark 14:1-15:47

"...He said, "Abba, Father, for you all things are possible; remove this cup from me; yet, not what I want, but what you want.""

Can you see how the first two readings logically lead to the theme of the Palm Sunday Gospel? The first reading speaks of God helping us in tough times so that we do not feel disgraced. The second shows us how He allowed Himself to be disgraced as the ultimate sacrifice for us. Now, it concludes by showing us that He only became the ultimate sacrifice when He submitted to His Father's will. In what ways can you embed this in your daily life as a follower and disciple of Jesus?
